DWIGHT '40

We received the following obituary for Elizabeth "Betsy" Chafee Conway from her family:

Elizabeth "Betsy" Conway, 99, died peacefully on October 10, 2021. Family and friends lost their family matriarch, filling all those around her with love, laughter, and music. Woe be to those who would challenge her at golf, tennis, badminton, or croquet! Uninformed with divergent political views had to be ready to defend themselves!

Born Sept. 5, 1922, in Barrington RI to parents Henry S. and Dorothy (Gladding) Chafee, she graduated from Mary C. Wheeler School, Dwight School, and Radcliffe College. She spent two of her primary school years in Switzerland where French became her primary language and skiing and hiking her passion. She would move from Providence and Barrington to the suburbs of Boston (Weston, Wellesley, and Needham) but her home was always her summer place in Sorrento, ME. Everyone would know she was in residence when the American flag flew.

Joys in Betsy's life were her extended family and friends, music, sports, traveling, and her country. For much of her life, she had two pianos in her living room. She would entice anyone into duets, no matter what skill level. For family and friends, there would always be singing childhood songs. Betsy organized Forty Forte Fingers for two pianos and four ladies in Barrington, joined a group of pianists in her Boston area, and played at North Hill, Needham. She also played the organ at The Dover Church and for more than four decades at Church of the Redeemer, Sorrento. All along, she would contribute music to Bagaduce Music library to include her compositions of two-piano, eight hand music.

Betsy was an avid golfer known for never getting in trouble on fairways and having a deadly eye around the greens. Playing until her 90's, her record of wins at Blink Bonnie Golf Links, Sorrento, will probably never be matched.

She was the first female member of the Barrington Republican Town Committee, a member of League of Women Voters, and active in Wellesley Republican politics where she met her husband Frank Conway. Together they would attend many national Republican Presidential Conventions.

With Frank, friends, and later her children, she would travel the world enjoying the sights, cultures, and people, but her favorite places always remained Sorrento, American Southwest, and Switzerland.

Pre-deceased by husband Frank H. Conway, she is survived by four children Arthur C. Lee (Helen), Sherrill L. Rosoff, William Jed Lee (Ann), and Henry C. Lee (Maureen), nine grandchildren, and thirteen great-grandchildren.

We received the sad news that **Stephen Flagg** passed away on Jan. 8, 2022. Here is a copy of his obituary notice that was published by *The New Haven Register* on Jan. 15, 2022:

Dr. Stephen Vreeland Flagg of Sanibel, FL, a plastic and hand surgeon, died at age 85 on January 8, 2022, surrounded by his loving family. Born in Hackensack, NJ, to the late Irene F. Richardson and John H. Flagg, he grew up in Oradell and Englewood, NJ. Dr. Flagg was a longtime resident of New Haven, CT, where he was in private practice for 35 years. He was an old-school doctor who devoted considerable time to caring for each patient, and his love of medicine and teachable moments continued throughout his 16 years of retirement. His humor and interest in people never diminished.

Dr. Flagg attended the Englewood School for Boys and Deerfield Academy ('53). He went to Yale University ('57), where he rowed for four years and was captain of the Lightweight Crew. He was a member of the Ring and Candle Society and treasured the friendships made there.

Dr. Flagg went to medical school at the College of Physicians and Surgeons, Columbia University, where he trained at The Roosevelt Hospital and did his residency in plastic surgery at New York University Medical Center under Dr. John Converse. He served as an assistant Senior Registrar at the Royal Victoria Infirmary, Newcastle upon Tyne, England, and then did a hand fellowship with Dr. J. W. Littler and Richard Eaton at The Roosevelt Hospital. He was an Assistant Professor of Plastic Surgery at Yale from late 1971 to 1973, the Associate Section Chief of Plastic Surgery at the Yale University School of Medicine from 1993-2000, and a Clinical Assistant Professor at Yale School of Medicine from 1973 until his retirement in 2006.

Dr. Flagg was awarded the Robert M. Goldwyn, M.D. Lifetime Achievement Award by the New England Society of Plastic and Reconstructive Surgeons in 2010. He was one of the founding members of the New England Society of Hand Surgery and later its president. He also served as the president of the Connecticut Society of Plastic Surgeons and president of the New England Society of Plastic and Reconstructive Surgeons (2005).

Outside of medicine, rowing was Dr. Flagg's passion. He joined the New Haven Rowing Club in 1982 and assisted in building their boathouse on the Housatonic River in Oxford, CT. He was president of the NHRC 1999-2000. He competed in Masters rowing events around the world, winning numerous medals. However, it was the friendships he made through rowing that he cherished most.

Dr. Flagg spent his summers at Point O' Woods, Fire Island, NY, where he developed lifelong friendships. He was Commodore of the POW Yacht Squadron in the early 1970s and relished his time on the sea, racing his Thistle with family and friends.

Dr. Flagg is survived by his loving family: His wife of 35 years, Edith Postlewaite Flagg, daughter Danielle Flagg, Richmond, VA, sons Alex Flagg (Denise), Lafayette, CA and Michael Flagg (Erica), Wellesley, MA, stepson Jonathan Hanf (Liezel), Pataskala, OH, and seven beloved grandchildren: Zachary, Tanner and Elise Flagg of Lafayette, CA, Addison and Samuel Flagg of Wellesley Hills, MA, and Zyrhrille and Jayce Hanf of Pataskala, OH. He is also survived by Cynthia Hixon Flagg, his first wife and the mother of his children.

Alumni Profiles

Robert Shafir '76

Jerry Shafir ESB '70, Mark Shafir '74, and Robert Shafir '76

▶ The Shafir brothers, who will be honored as co-recipients of the 2022 Distinguished Alumni Award, can be said to have reached the highest heights in their respective industries. For **Robert Shafir '76**, that distinction involves serving as the chief executive officer at Sculptor Capital, having previously served in a number of executive positions, including CEO and chairman of Credit Suisse Americas. Meanwhile, **Mark Shafir '74** serves as the global co-head of mergers and acquisitions at Citibank, having previously worked at Lehman Brothers under the same title and at Goldman Sachs as vice president, among other high-level positions. Their financial industry stature notwithstanding, it was actually the eldest brother, **Jerry Shafir ESB**

'**70**, a food industry entrepreneur, whose relentless pursuit of profitability was once featured on the front-page of the *Wall Street Journal*.

"One of the jokes in the family is that while I was stirring soups and kettles and cleaning pots and pans, they [Robert and Mark] were making big bucks in Wall Street," Jerry said. The co-founder of Kettle Cuisine, Jerry nurtured his company from soup making for restaurants and other bulk customers in the mid-1980s to more recent marketing and distribution success, selling individual servings to grocery store customers seeking high-quality heatand-serve soup.

Jerry's 50th Class Reunion was postponed due to Covid-19, but he has good memories of his time at the Englewood School for Boys, marked by academic rigor and the lifelong relationships he cultivated at the school. He credits his success at Yale University and beyond to his foundational education at ESB. "Mr. Malcolm Duffy was my 7th and 11th grade English teacher. I remember the first paper I got back had more red ink and words of his than I had written for the paper!" Jerry recalled. "He was very intimidating but really great. I had him again in 11th grade where we did a lot of theater. I ended up doing a little theater at Yale, and I felt like I had gotten a foundation in literature and plays, which was incredible."

After Yale, Jerry decided to enroll in law school at Boston University, but it did not suit him well. "I hated law school so much that I took classic piano lessons just to give me an outlet," Jerry said. In the meantime, he began working within the seafood industry at Legal Sea Foods in Boston and got married to Lorna, his wife of 28 years and counting. With more entrepreneurial experience under his belt and a growing family on the way, Jerry pivoted to enroll at Harvard Business School, subsequently using his professional connections and legal and business knowledge to launch Kettle Cuisine.

Meanwhile, Robert and Mark were pursuing business and finance. Robert received a bachelor's degree in economics from Lafayette and an MBA from Columbia Business School. Mark received an MBA from University of Pennsylvania and became a Marshall Scholar at Kings College, Cambridge. The Shafir brothers' shared passion for business can be attributed to their family roots. Their father, Jere, was a Polish immigrant and businessman who owned a scissors and shears company, and their mother, Mary, was a born-and-raised New Yorker from Irish immigrants. Both strongly believed in a well-rounded education. For Jerry, running Kettle Cuisine for 25 years became an education unto itself. From staying late in an industrial kitchen making chicken broth to building relationships with prospective investors, Jerry got a taste of everything in the industry. In the 1980s and 1990s, when rapid globalization and mass production were burgeoning, Jerry focused on fresh ingredients and homestyle cooking methods. Gradually, painstakingly, he brought his company to profitability, and by 2011 Kettle Cuisine had grown to over 250 employees. In 2013 Jerry sold the company and retired, although he has recently taken a venture in the sports complex industry. He spends his time now between Fort Myers, Florida, and Newport, Rhode Island. Not to mention that he and his brothers—always competitive with each other-still get together to play golf.

Reflecting on the hard choices he has had to make and what wisdom he'd pass on to younger alums, he said with a laugh, "I would say go work after college before going straight to law school and committing three years of your life." He added, "I'm a big believer in continuous learning. Life is continuing education, and I'm never going to stop learning."
